What is the importance of data to our organizing?

- Impossible to organize teachers (recruit and involve) unless we know who they are and how we can find/ contact them.
- The more information we can collect on/about our teachers, the more equipped we are to make better decisions about our internal organizing.
- Constantly engaging with teachers in two-way communication helps the union to stay relevant and perceived by members as a "listening organization."



Our Basic Data Needs

What is basic information we should collect?

- Full Name / Unique Identifier
- Gender
- Job title / Classification
- Worksite / Department
- Work Hours
- Home address / Phone Numbers/ E-Mail Addresses
- Birth Date / Hire Date
- Work contact information
- Voter Registration Status
- Membership Status (Active/Fee Payer/Potential/Retired)
- Activist Status (Officer/Worksite Leader/ Activist)
- Other?



Our Advanced Data Needs

What information might help us organize more effectively?

- Volunteered Issues of Concern
- Volunteered Attitudes Toward the Union
- History of Union Involvement/Contact
- Assessment of Union Support (1 to 4 scale / Hot, Warm, Cold)
- "Leader" Designation
- Special Certifications/Qualifications/Skills
- Community and Faith Organizational Involvement
- Residency by Political Jurisdiction
- Other?



What is the value of all this data to us?

- Developing our union's issue-based program.
- Segmenting and targeting organizing efforts.
- Tracking and building activism.
- Influencing the way we communicate about the union
- Understanding teachers' perceptions of the union and acting accordingly to maintain desired level of commitment and activism.



How do we get all this data?

- Employer (electronic list ideal)
- Organizing Conversations (One on Ones)
- "Count Me In Cards"
- Surveys / Focus Groups and Other Discussion Groups / Canvassing / Etc.
- Sign-in Sheets / Activism Tracking
- List matching / Data Exchange with AFT, Telematch, etc.
- Google and Other Search Engines
- Other?
